

Student Health Information Requests for Registration

Please Read the following information:

If you are Registering your child for Pre-K:

- DTaP** - 4 doses (last given after the 4th birthday). DTaP is Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis
- Polio** - 3 doses with the last given after the 4th birthday
- MMR** - after the 1st birthday, or proof of immunity. MMR is Measles, Mumps and Rubella (German Measles)
- Varicella** - after the 1st birthday, proof of immunity or disease history Varicella is Chicken Pox
- HiB** – at least 1 dose after the 1st birthday. HiB is Haemophilus Influenzae type b
- Pneumococcal** – at least 1 dose after the 1st birthday
- Flu** - given after 9/1 and before 12/31 of the current year

If you are Registering your child for Kindergarten or 1st Grade:

- DTaP** – 4 doses if the 4th is after the 4th birthday or any 5 doses
- Polio** – 3 doses with the last dose after the 4th birthday or any 4 doses
- MMR** – must have the 1st after the 1st birthday and then a 2nd dose; or proof of immunity
- Varicella** – after the 1st birthday, proof of immunity or disease history
- Hepatitis B** – 3 doses or lab evidence

If you are Registering your child for 2nd Grade – 5th Grade:

- DTaP** – 3 doses with the last dose after the 4th birthday or any 4 doses
- Polio** – 3 doses with the last dose after the 4th birthday or any 4 doses
- MMR** – must have the 1st after the 1st birthday and then a 2nd dose; or proof of immunity
- Varicella** – after the 1st birthday, proof of immunity or disease history
- Hepatitis B** – 3 doses or lab evidence

If you are Registering your child for 6th Grade (or the age for 6th grade if in Self Contained):

- Tdap** – 1 dose given after 10th birthday
- DTaP** – 3 doses
- Polio** – any 3 doses
- MMR** – the 2 doses or lab evidence
- Varicella** – as above or lab evidence
- Hepatitis B series** – 3 if begun in infant, 2 if using the adult type starting at age 11-15 or lab evidence
- Meningococcal (Menactra)** – 1 dose at age 11

All Grades:

A school entry **physical examination** by your Primary Care Practitioner performed in the last 365 days is required. If medicine is needed at school, we will need paperwork from the doctor and your consent to give any medicine to your child. All medicine must be in its original sealed and labeled container brought to school by an **adult**. If your child is enrolling from out of the USA, he/she must have a **Mantoux PPD** to test for Tuberculosis based on the current country listing.
